- Assist with outreach events and activities including, but not limited to:
  - NAYI, Husker Harvest Days, State FFA Convention, Women in Ag Conference
- Provide general office support and assist with day-to-day project coordination
- Internship will be tailored to the student's interest and skills

## Qualifications

Any student enrolled in a post-secondary institution located near Lincoln, Nebraska with the following qualifications:
